Division of Academic Affairs wishes to propose this tentative schedule for all course offerings for Summer Semester 2020:

- 1. A total of 8 academic programs are offering courses without lab components. The first 4 programs (ACNR/AGR, Arts/Humanities, Business, CLP) will hold instructions online via MOODLE interchangeably on Mondays and Wednesdays, and meet at ASCC on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The last 4 programs (Health/HS, Social Science/History, Lang & Lit, Mathematics) will meet on campus on Mondays and Wednesdays, and meet via MOODLE on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- 2. All Nursing Courses are to meet on campus on Mondays and Tuesdays. The Nursing Department will utilize Wednesdays and Thursdays for clinical and hands-on requirements at LBJ.
- 3. CAPP Courses (English and Math) will meet on campus every Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, and use MOODLE on Tuesdays.
- 4. Four main academic programs hold a lab component that is required. These courses will meet on campus from Monday to Thursday.
- 5. All TED courses will do 50% of classroom interactions, and 50% MOODLE. This schedule will be at the discretion of the program director and department, based on students' schedules and adjuncts from DOE. Director De La Rosa had already submitted their schedule to prepare for this summer's TED session.
- 6. Lastly, all course offerings will meet on MOODLE every FRIDAY.
